Knowing about all of the government schemes is one thing, but candidates must also understand their purpose. Candidates have a better chance of scoring high marks if they read the aim of each project listed below.

1. Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana: The Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana is a National Mission on Financial Inclusion that offers an integrated approach to achieving full financial inclusion and providing banking services to all households in the country.

2. Make in India: Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the 'Make in India' campaign, which will facilitate investment, foster innovation, strengthen intellectual property protection, and build best-in-class.

3. Swachh Bharat Mission: As a national movement, the Swachh Bharat Mission was launched throughout the country. The campaign's goal is to achieve a "Clean India" vision by October 2, 2019.

4. Beti Bachao Beti Padhao: This scheme aims to educate girls to make them socially and financially self-sufficient.

5. Atal Pension Yojna: The Atal Pension Yojna is a pension scheme that primarily aims to provide a universal pension scheme for those working in the unorganised sector, such as maids, gardeners, delivery boys, and so on. This scheme took the place of the previous Swavalamban Yojana, which was poorly received by the public.

6. Digital India Mission: Digital India programme is India's flagship programme to transform India into a digitally empowered society and knowledge economy.

8. Gold Monetisation Scheme: The Government of India launched the Gold Monetisation Scheme in 2015. One can deposit gold in any form in a GMS account and earn interest as the price of gold metal rises.

9. PM CARES Fund - The Prime Minister's Citizen Assistance and Relief in Emergency Situation Funds established by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. This national trust was established to address future distressed and dreadful situations such as COVID-19.

10. Aarogya Setu: The Indian government took the lead in combating the Coronavirus pandemic. An app called

Aarogya Setu launched a mobile application to raise awareness of COVID 19 among Indian citizens.

11. Ayushman Bharat: Ayushman Bharat is a healthcare scheme launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in 2018. It is the world's most extensive government-funded healthcare programme.

12. UMANG – Mobile application launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to provide citizens with secure access to multiple government services on a single platform. UMANG is a critical component of the government's Digital India initiative, which aims to make all traditional offline government services available online 24 hours a day, seven days a week, through a single unified app.

13. Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan – The Union Government's full-fledged economic stimulus package is known as the scheme (meaning self-reliance India scheme). It was launched to empower people and overcome the challenges posed by the coronavirus pandemic.

14. National Digital Health Mission –The mission, which will be launched on August 15, 2020, aims to create an integrated healthcare system that will digitally connect practitioners and patients by providing them with access to real-time health records.

15. PM Atmanirbhar Swasth Bharat Yojana – Atmanirbhar Swasth Bharat Yojana of Prime Minister Atmanirbhar Swasth Bharat Yojana to strengthen existing national institutions and establish new ones, to detect and treat new and emerging diseases.

16. National Infrastructure Pipeline Project – This is a social and economic infrastructure project that began in 2019, intending to improve all citizens' overall quality of life.

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
